Antitrust

The discussion should not address market allocation, pricing, or similar anticompetitive matters.

Intellectual Property

If a participant knows his or her company has patent claims that cover a portion of the spec or standard under discussion, he or she is obligated to disclose those claims, and the company must either agree to negotiate RAND (Reasonable and Non-Discriminatory) license terms or the WG will have to try to work around the claims (and the company may be asked not to participate further if this happens repeatedly).

 - Conformant products Discussion of the conformance tools, process, and output. Jeff provided perspective on what tools were in place and that they were primarily to support PACS vendors.



- Further discussion about how the "Conduit Companies" could achieve conformance. Considering that they were likely to have implementation in conjunction with a particular PACS vendor (for example, Alert Enterprise with Lenel, RightCrowd with Tyco; or Quantum Secure with Kastle) they may have different compliance certifications.
- Jeff reviewed the implementation guide and provided tips on how Alert Enterprise could get started on their PLAI agent/adapter development and considerations for the process.
