- We're planning a Plugfest for products and systems based on our Area Control specification, version 2.0 of which was released late last year.
- Our Recording and Content Management (RaCM) specification is being enhanced with the addition of a software profile. RaCM-compliant systems can easily integrate digital video data into their functions.
- ISC West planning is under way, and we hope to have significant announcements there about PSIA-compliant product releases as well as developments with the new Physical-Logical Access Interoperability (PLAI) specification.
